Admission Requirements

Applicants are considered on an individual basis. In addition to the Graduate College minimum requirements, applicants must meet the following program requirements:

- Baccalaureate Field Applicants must hold a baccalaureate degree or an advanced professional degree in a health professions discipline.
- Other Requirements At least 3.00/4.00 for the final 60 semester hours (90 quarter hours) of undergraduate study.
- Tests Required None.
- Minimum English Competency Test Score (test scores cannot be more than two years old; UIC's Institutional Code is 1851.)
 - TOEFL iBT 80, with subscores of Reading 19, Listening 17, Speaking 20, and Writing 21, OR,
 - IELTS Academic 6.5, with 6.0 in each of the four subscores, OR,
 - PTE-Academic 54, with subscores of Reading 51, Listening 47, Speaking 53, and Writing 56.
- Letters of Recommendation Three required.
- Personal Statement Required. For the personal statement form and template see the MHPE admissions web page.
