^a A single course may only be counted toward one requirement. For example, LING 230 can be applied toward either the foundational selective requirement or the additional LING course requirement, but not both.

^b LING 496 may be applied towards these 9 hours; however, the course must be taken as a 3-semester-hour course, and it can only be applied once. A maximum of 6 hours of LING 300 and a maximum of 6 hours of LING 459 may count toward this requirement.
