

MD - Emergency Medicine-Peoria (PEMD)

Courses

PEMD 640. Introduction to Emergency Medicine. 4 hours.

The main goal of this course is to develop the skills of the M3/M4 student in the diagnosis and management of an undifferentiated patient in an emergency department setting. Course Information: Field work required. Prerequisite(s): Completion of 2nd Year.

PEMD 641. Advanced Emergency Medicine. 4 hours.

The elective is for students who are entering the field of Emergency Medicine. Students will assume intern level responsibility for patient care. Course Information: Field work required. Prerequisite(s): Completion of 3rd Year.

PEMD 660. Clinical Simulation. 4 hours.

The Jump Trading Simulation and Education Center provides an outstanding opportunity for students interested in academic careers to participate in the use of simulation technology to improve patient safety, quality, and to reduce healthcare costs. Course Information: Field work required. Prerequisite(s): Completion of 3rd Year.

PEMD 690. Away Rotation in Emergency Medicine. 1-15 hours.

An elective in Emergency Medicine taken outside the University of Illinois College of Medicine with prior approval. Course Information: May be repeated. Students may enroll in more than one section per term. Field work required. Prerequisite(s): Completion of 3rd Year.

PEMD 694. Special Topics in Emergency Medicine. 1-15 hours.

Special or new topics in Emergency Medicine. Course Information: May be repeated. Students may enroll in more than one section per term. Field work required. Prerequisite(s): Completion of 3rd Year.

PEMD 696. Individualized Elective in Emergency Medicine. 1-15 hours.

Individualized elective in Emergency Medicine under the supervision of a faculty member or physician to fit students' interests or customized experiences with prior approval. Course Information: May be repeated. Students may enroll in more than one section per term. Field work required. Prerequisite(s): Completion of 2nd Year.

PEMD 697. Research Elective in Emergency Medicine. 1-15 hours.

Student-proposed research under a faculty member in Emergency Medicine; available with prior approval. Course Information: May be repeated. Students may enroll in more than one section per term. Field work required. Prerequisite(s): Completion of 2nd Year.
