Concentration Requirements

Students earning graduate degrees in the participating programs may complement their courses by enrolling in a concentration in Gender and Women's Studies after consulting with their graduate advisor. Students pursuing this concentration must apply to the director of interdepartmental graduate concentration in the Gender and Women's Studies Program and obtain approval from a graduate faculty member from within the department of the degree and preferably one who is affiliated with Gender and Women's Studies. Either this person or another faculty member in the Gender and Women's Studies Program becomes the student's Interdisciplinary Concentration advisor.

Students should enroll in a total of 16 hours of graduate course work for the concentration: GWS 501 and GWS 502, plus 8 additional hours of Gender and Women's Studies or cross-listed courses at the graduate level or the equivalent. Up to 4 of these hours can be directed study or thesis research on an appropriate topic approved by the student's advisor.

Interdepartmental Graduate Concentration in Women's Health

Students with an interest in Gender and Women's Studies who are pursuing a graduate degree in the College of Nursing or School of Public Health may complement their courses by enrolling in a concentration in Women's Health after consulting with their advisor.
