Admission Requirements

Applicants are considered on a competitive basis. In addition to the Graduate College minimum requirements, applicants must meet the following program requirements:

- Baccalaureate Field No restrictions.
- Grade Point Average At least 3.00/4.00 for the final 60 semester (90 quarter) hours of undergraduate study.
- Tests Required None.
- Minimum English Competency Test Score
 - TOEFL iBT 80, with subscores of Reading 19, Listening 17, Speaking 20, and Writing 21, OR,
 - IELTS Academic 6.5, with 6.0 in each of the four subscores, OR,
 - PTE-Academic 54, with subscores of Reading 51, Listening 47, Speaking 53, and Writing 56.
- Letters of Recommendation Three required, preferably from faculty members in political science or cognate disciplines who are familiar with the applicant's training and ability.
- Personal Statement Required. The statement should address the applicant's academic goals.
- Deadlines <u>Application deadlines</u> for this program are listed on the Graduate College website.

Degree Requirements

In addition to the Graduate College minimum requirements, students must meet the following program requirements:

- Minimum Semester Hours Required 34.
- Coursework Required coursework totals 18 semester hours.
 Required courses will not be waived. A grade of B or better is required in all required courses.
