Certificate in Cooperative Career Experience

The Certificate in Co-Operative Career Experience is awarded by the Department of Disability and Human Development (DHD). Students must complete 36 hours over four terms. Co-Op students will explore their career interests through a combination of work placements and academic course work relating to the area of focus they have selected. Students must select one area of focus from three options: (1) Arts and Culture; (2) Social Justice, Policy, and Leadership; (3) Health and Care across the Lifespan.
