Students who desire to pursue careers for which a professional degree is required may take the necessary course work to apply to such programs in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. Preprofessional advisors who specialize in pre-health and pre-law advising are able to assist students in pursuing programs in the following areas:

- Pre-Dentistry
- Pre-Law
- Pre-Medicine (M.D./D.O. and podiatric medicine)
- Pre-Nursing
- · Pre-Nutrition/Registered Dietician
- · Pre-Occupational Therapy
- · Pre-Optometry
- · Pre-Pharmacy
- Pre-Physical Therapy
- Pre-Physician Assistant
- · Pre-Veterinary Medicine

Preprofessional advisors are available to meet with students during individual appointment sessions and group workshops. On-demand webinars are also available for students interested in pre-health fields. Students interested in preprofessional studies should visit the LAS Pre-Health website or the LAS Pre-Law website for information regarding webinars, upcoming workshops, and other related information. Students can also find information regarding how to schedule an appointment with a Pre-Health or Pre-Law advisor.

Preprofessional studies in Pre-Dentistry, Pre-Law, Pre-Medicine, Pre-Nutrition/Registered Dietician, Pre-Occupational Therapy, Pre-Optometry, Pre-Physical Therapy, Pre-Physician Assistant, and Pre-Veterinary Medicine require students to complete an undergraduate degree program, including a major and prerequisite coursework. In most cases, the bachelor's degree is required prior to matriculation to the professional program. If admitted, students complete a professional degree program and graduate with a post-baccalaureate professional degree.

The UIC College of Nursing offers entry to first-year students into the Bachelor of Science in Nursing major, but because of the interest and demand in nursing, not all eligible students can be admitted. LAS Pre-Health Advising assists pre-nursing students who are enrolled in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences to prepare for a future in a nursing career. LAS Pre-Health Advisors work with students to determine which nursing pathway is the best option for them. Prerequisite courses for nursing programs, including the BSN and MSN, are available. Students may pursue any major in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, including the Bachelor of Science in Integrated Health Studies:

Concentration in Behavioral Health major, which incorporates many of the prerequisite courses required for admission to nursing programs.

Preprofessional study in Pre-Pharmacy requires students to complete a minimum of two years of undergraduate study prior to admission to the College of Pharmacy. In most cases, three years of undergraduate study are needed to complete the prerequisite course work. A majority of the students admitted to the College of Pharmacy PharmD program have completed a bachelor's degree at the time of matriculation. If admitted, students complete four additional years of study in the UIC College of Pharmacy and graduate with a Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) degree.

Students interested in the preprofessional study of pharmacy may also consider the Bachelor of Science in Pharmaceutical Science (BSPB). The BSPS requires students to complete at least two years of undergraduate study prior to admission to the major in the UIC College of Pharmacy. In some instances, completion of this major may take more time than anticipated if the student needs to satisfy prerequisites, or when a student does not take courses in the proper sequence. If admitted, students complete at least two additional years of undergraduate study in the major and graduate with a bachelor's degree while completing the first year of the PharmD program.

Completion of prerequisite coursework does not guarantee admission to a professional college or program. Students pursuing preprofessional studies are strongly encouraged to consult an LAS preprofessional advisor and an advisor in the professional program before submitting an application. Each professional program has specific application procedures, deadlines, and requirements, which can change from time to time and may not be reflected in this catalog. Students are responsible for obtaining the most current information.

Students pursuing preprofessional studies must plan their course of study with care. Advisors are available to assist students, however, the responsibility for selecting courses and meeting admission requirements rests with the individual student who must plan and select courses consistent with the program requirements. The information below provides the current prerequisite course information for the UIC or UIUC professional programs. LAS preprofessional advisors can assist students in applying to programs outside of UIC as well.

### **Pre-Pharmacy**

Preprofessional studies in pre-pharmacy require at least two years of undergraduate study prior to matriculation in the professional program or major. Pre-Pharmacy students may apply to and complete either the BS in Pharmaceutical Sciences or the Doctor of Pharmacy degree in the College of Pharmacy.
